

## **Italian Studies and History Double Major (54 Credits)**

### Prerequisites for the Italian Studies Major

- Italian 1103, 1103.02 or 5051

### Requirements for the Italian Studies Major with a History concentration (30 credits)

- (3 credits) Italian 2102
- (6 credits) two 3000-level courses taught in Italian
- (3 credits) one 4000-level or above course taught in Italian  
Credits for content courses (not language courses) taught in Italy that have been pre-approved by an OSU advisor may replace these content courses in Italian from the French and Italian Department.
- (6 credits) 2 courses taught in English in the Department of French and Italian of which only one course can be at the 2000-level, one at the 3000-level or above and one at the 4000-level or above.  
Credits for content courses (not language courses) from any OSU approved study abroad program in Italy that have been pre-approved by the advisor may replace content courses from the French and Italian Department. (See table A below).
- (12 credits) 4 courses from the History Department selected from Table B or students may petition for a course that is not on this list.

### Requirements for the History Major (21 credits)

- Category A: Skills Acquisition (9 credit hours)

History 2800: Introduction to the Discipline of History  
One 4000-level Reading Seminar in History  
One 4000-level Research Seminar in History

- Category B: Breadth (12 credit hours)

2 courses (6 credit hours) focusing chronologically on the period before 1750  
2 courses (6 credit hours) focusing chronologically on the period after 1750  
2 courses (6 credit hours) focusing primarily on East Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, Central Asia, and South Asia  
2 courses (6 credit hours) focusing primarily on Europe  
1 course (3 credit hours) focusing on comparative, transnational, transregional, or global history

Note: At least 21 credit hours must be **at the 3000-level or above**. This includes the two required 4000-level seminars (6 cr. hrs.) plus at least 15 credit hours at the 3000-level & above. One 2000-level History course must be taken prior to enrolling in a 3000-level History course (or instructor permission). One 3000-level History course must be taken prior to enrolling in a 4000-level or a 5000-level History course.

Ideally, the 4000-level Reading Seminar will be taken prior to the 4000-level Research Seminar.

Students wishing to graduate with research distinction may substitute 3 credits of 4999 or 4999H: *Undergraduate thesis* for one course offered in English from the Department of French and Italian and 3 credits for one similar from the History Department.
