Prerequisites for the French Major

- French 1103.01, 1103.51 or 1103.61; 2101

Requirements for the French Major (30 hours total)

- (6 credits) French 3101 and 4100
- (15 credits) 5 additional courses at the 3000 level or above (one of these may be replaced by an approved course in English)
- (9 credits) 3 additional courses at the 4000 level or above, at least 1 of which must be at the 5000 level or above.

A course of interest for Psychology majors:

French 3301 Discovering Second Language Acquisition

Credits for content courses (not language courses) from any OSU approved study abroad program that have been pre-approved by the advisor may replace content courses from the French and Italian Department.
