- 1. The above is a model <u>only.</u> Each student's four-year plan will vary depending upon AP credit, PSEO Credit, summer classes, study abroad plans, etc. Students have the opportunity to enrich their program of study by pursuing Minors or Second majors or Dual Degree options outside the business curriculum.
- 2. BUS CORE courses include: Bus M&L 3250 (3), Bus Mgt 3230 (3), Bus MHR 3200 (3), Bus Fin 3220 (3), Bus MHR 2000 (1.5), Bus Fin 3500 (1.5), and Bus M&L 3380 (1.5). Students must be admitted to the BSBA major program prior to taking these courses. Students should take the core introductory business course for their intended specialization in the Autumn Semester of the Junior Year.
- 3. Business Specializations range from 15-27 hours. Prerequisites to all specialization courses: AMIS 2200 and 2300, Bus Mgt 2320, Bus Mgt 2321, Bus MHR 2292, core course for the specialization. Students must complete the core course for the specialization with a C- or better.
- 4. Only the International Business specialization requires foreign language (through level 1103).
- 5. Students are encouraged to schedule General Education (Gen Ed) courses throughout the four year.
- 6. Students are encouraged to pursue a summer internship abroad in a French-speaking country, for which they can earn 3 credits of French 4690.
